Catholic Social Teaching—A bit of background info!

Catholic Social Teaching is a body of doctrine developed by the church to help us put into action the teachings of Jesus Christ in our lives, community, our parish and families. It's fundamental principle recognizes the dignity of the human person. Social ministries which reflect Catholic Social Teaching are an essential part of a Catholic parish because they help a parish do more and be more. They are a reflection of the gospel and help build a faithful and spiritual community.

Our FISH Ministry highlights one of seven themes in Catholic Social Teaching: Option for the Poor and Vulnerable

A basic moral test for any community is how the most vulnerable members among us are faring. In a society marred by deepening divisions between rich and poor, our tradition recalls the story of the Last Judgment (Mt 25:31-46) and instructs us to put the needs of the poor and vulnerable first.

Catholic Social Teaching continued...

The primary purpose of this special commitment to the poor is to enable them to become active participants in the life of society. It is to enable all persons to share in and contribute to the common good. The "option for the poor", therefore, is not an adversarial slogan that pits one group or class against another. Rather it states that the deprivation and powerlessness of the poor wounds the whole community. The extent of their suffering is a measure of how far we are from being a true community of persons. These wounds will be healed only by greater solidarity with the poor and among the poor themselves.

Economic Justice for All, #88

The Catholic bishops of the United States believe building a just economy that works for all encompasses a wide range of issues, including food security and hunger, work and joblessness, homelessness and affordable housing, and tax credits for low-income families, as well as protecting programs that serve poor and vulnerable people throughout the federal budget.

Fatima has both a morning group that prepares and serves breakfast and an afternoon group that prepares and serves dinner. Both groups provide meals on Saturdays every three weeks. These meals are funded exclusively through your donations made to the parish "poor box" located just inside the side doors of the church. Welcome INN has been helping the needy and marginalized of South Orange County for over 20 years. Seven days a week, 365 days a year, volunteers serve no-cost meals to homeless and low-income people in the Capistrano Beach. A dinner meal is served every day and breakfast on Friday and Saturday

mornings. Approximately 50-70 people are served daily — many of them regular guests.



Welcome INN is a non-

profit, all volunteer organization reflecting the collaboration of more than a dozen faith communities throughout south county. In addition to offering hot meals and other necessities, Welcome INN works with groups like FAM, iHOPE and Mission Hospital to connect its guests with other resources. While meals are served literally on the street, Welcome INN dreams of a permanent location where folks can eat with more dignity.

Welcome INN was founded by Christian volunteers who desired to follow Jesus' command to care for the less fortunate treating all with dignity, love, and respect. There is no requirement for those coming for a meal. Everyone is welcome.
